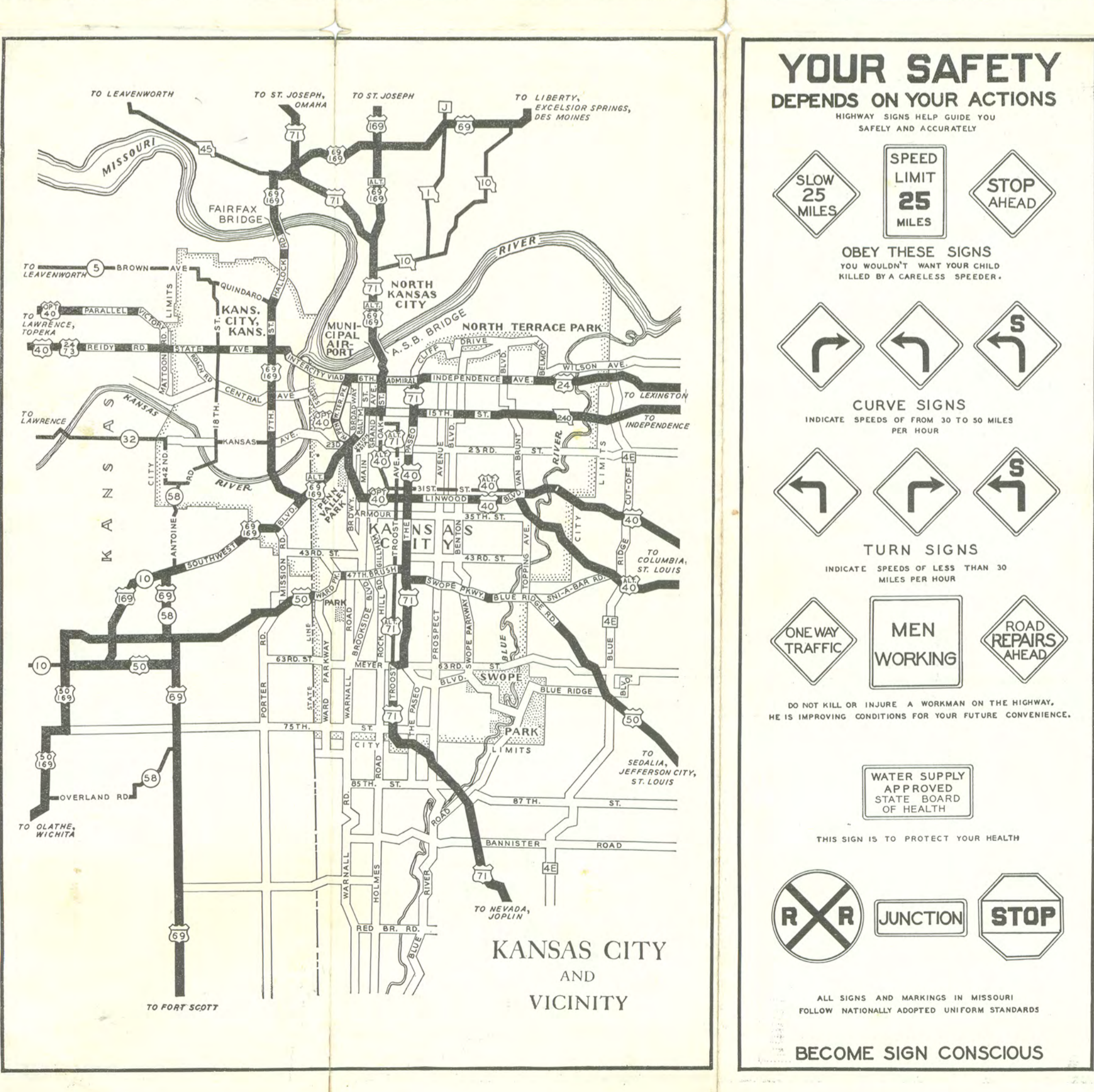
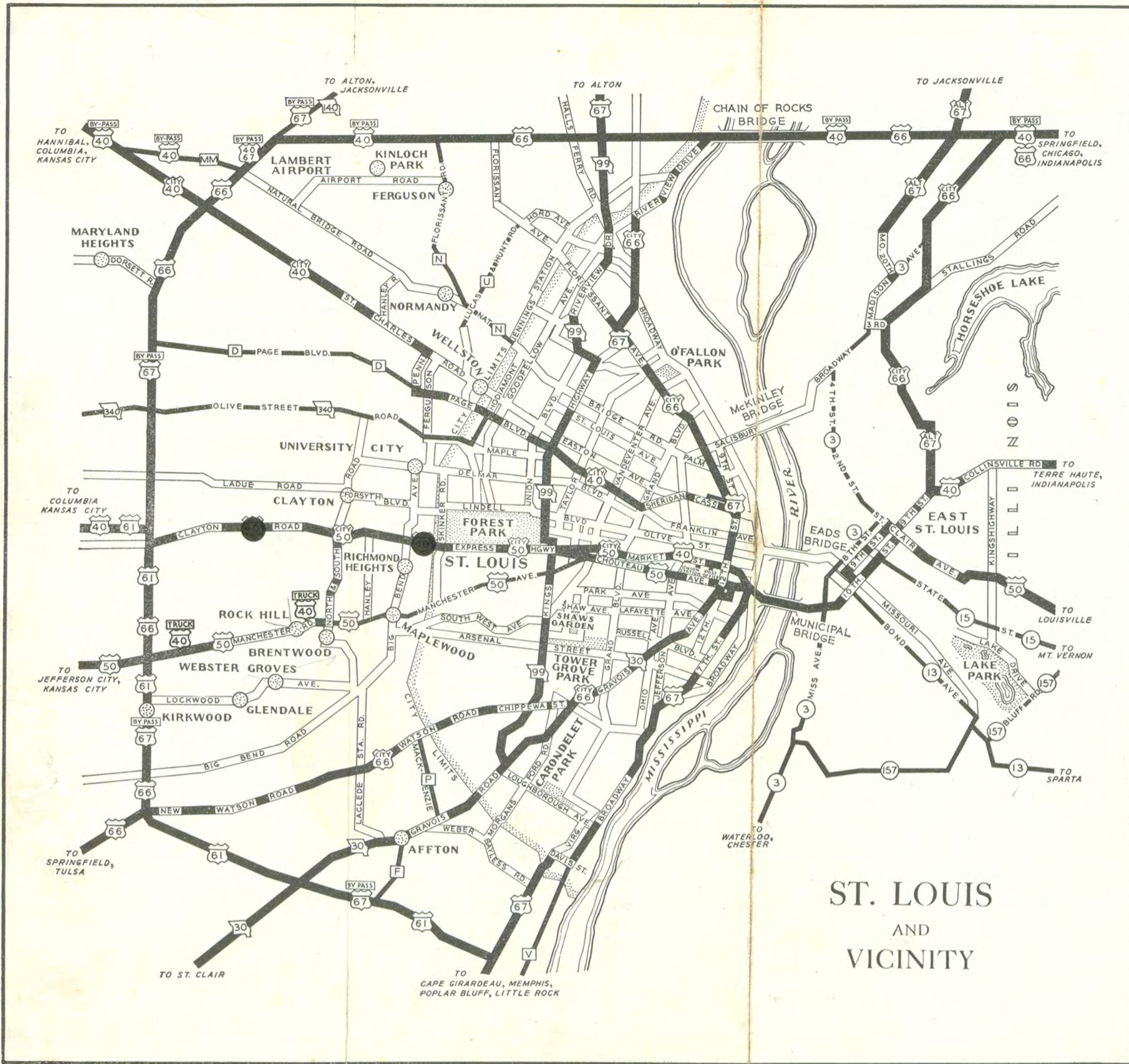

DRIVING CODE OF THE MISSOURI STATE HIGHWAY PATROL

- 1. Keep your car under control at all times.
2. Be sure brakes are in good working order.
3. See that both headlights and taillight are working.
4. Keep on the right side of roadway; don't straddle or hug the center line.
5. Don't pass another car until you can see that the way ahead is clear for a safe distance.
6. Don't drive at a speed that may endanger yourself or others.
7. Proceed cautiously at intersecting highways and when meeting pedestrians.
8. Don't permit passengers or merchandise to crowd the driver's seat.
9. Give your whole attention to the job of driving.
10. Have consideration for the other fellow. It's partly his road, you know.

STATE HIGHWAY PATROL SAFETY CODE FOR CHILDREN

- To help children help themselves in the high-way safety problem, the following principles should be drilled into every young mind.
a. Walk on the left side of the road facing the approaching automobiles.
b. When walking down the highways in groups, walk in single file.
c. Before crossing the street, look first to the left, then to the right.
d. Do not play games along the street or highway while at school or while going to and from school.
e. Do not roller skate in the street or on the highway.
f. Do not heedlessly run into the street or highway after a ball.
g. Do not hitch on to trolley cars, wagons or automobiles.
h. Do not run into the street or highway from behind parked automobiles or moving vehicles.
i. Do not hold an umbrella in a manner that will obstruct your view of the road in front.
j. Never ride a bicycle on the highway for sport.
k. When riding coasters wagons be sure to have same under control so as not to run into someone on the walk or run out in front of an automobile.
l. When riding horses or ponies on the streets or highways, keep them close to the right-hand side of the road.
m. Do not beg or accept a ride from strangers along a highway.
n. Do not ride a bicycle with solid tires.
o. Do not throw banana peeling on the sidewalks.
p. Do not attempt to cross an intersection that is perpendicular from the street without watching the arm movements of the approaching driver.
q. Walk in all marked pedestrian lanes at street intersections.
