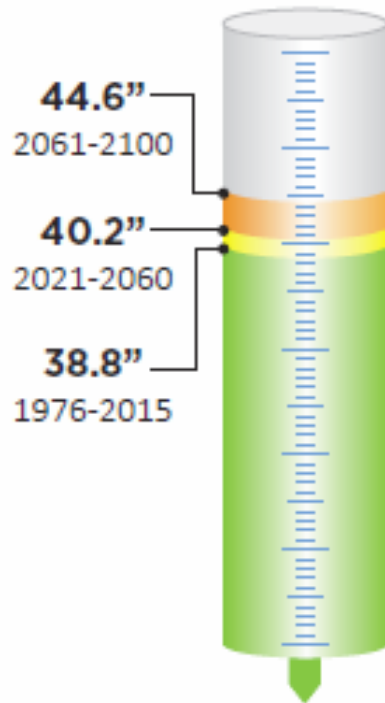

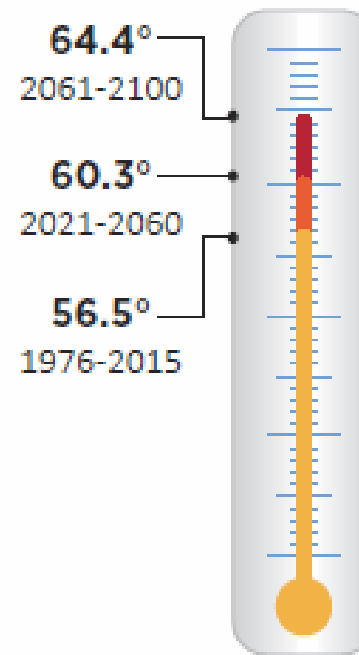
Downscale projections for metro KC

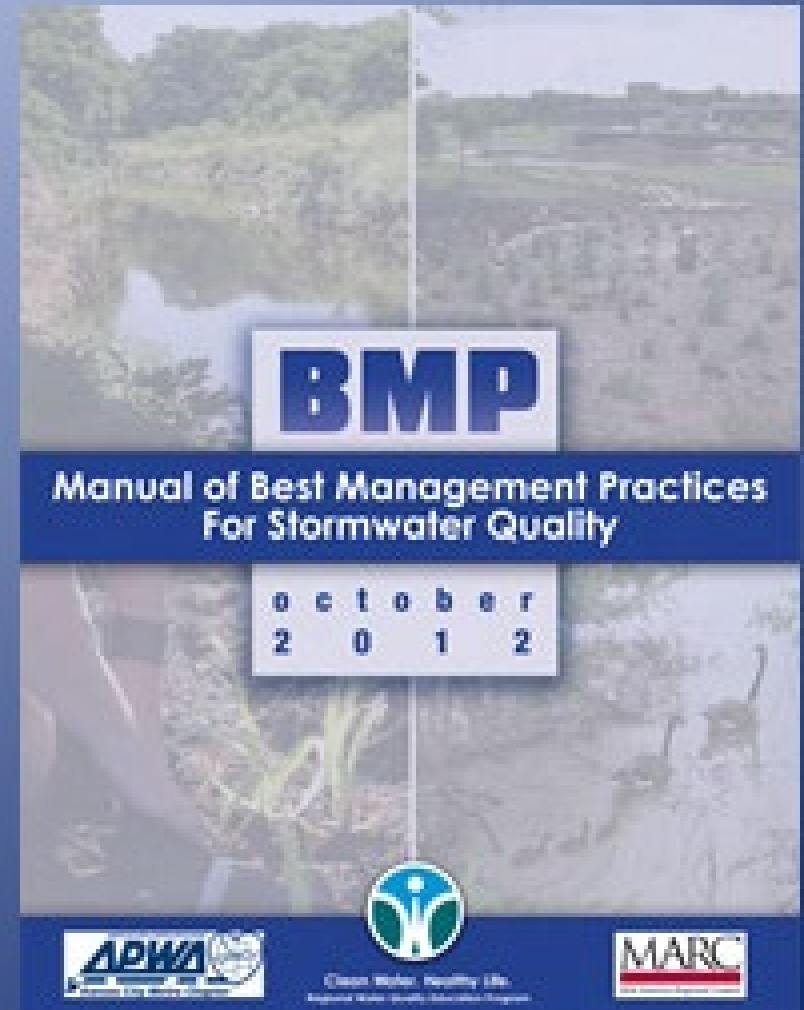

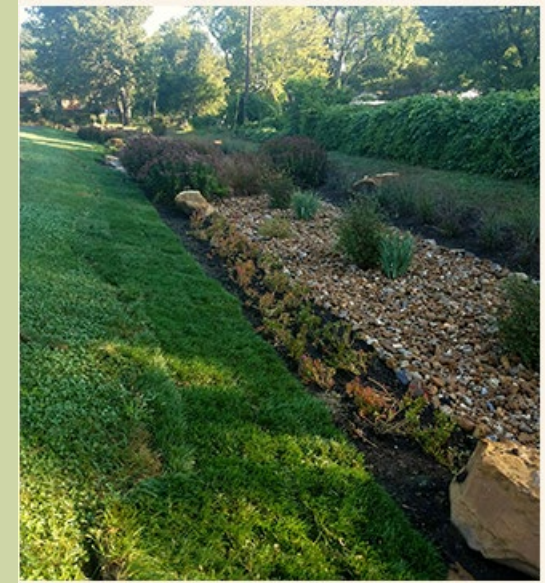

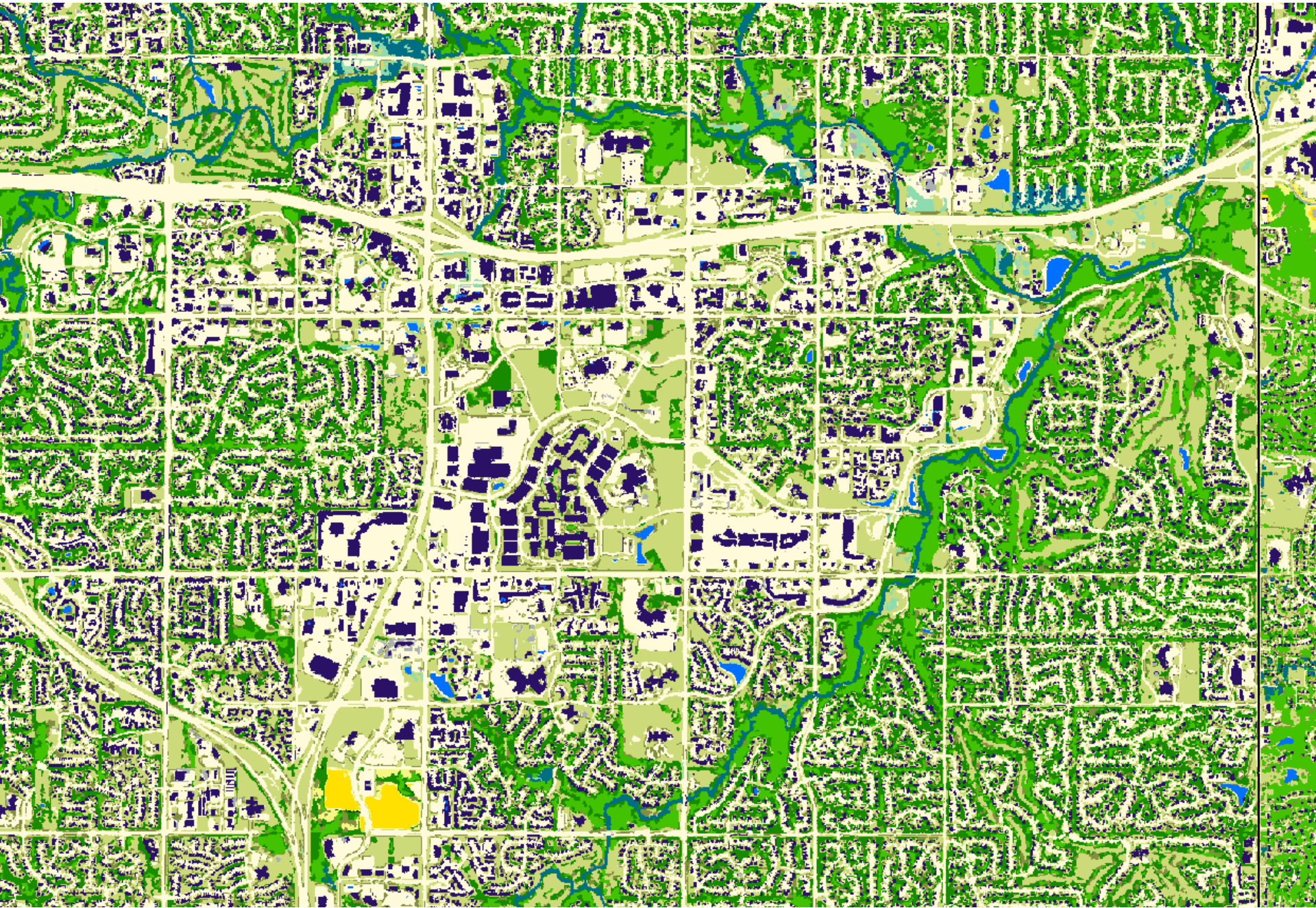

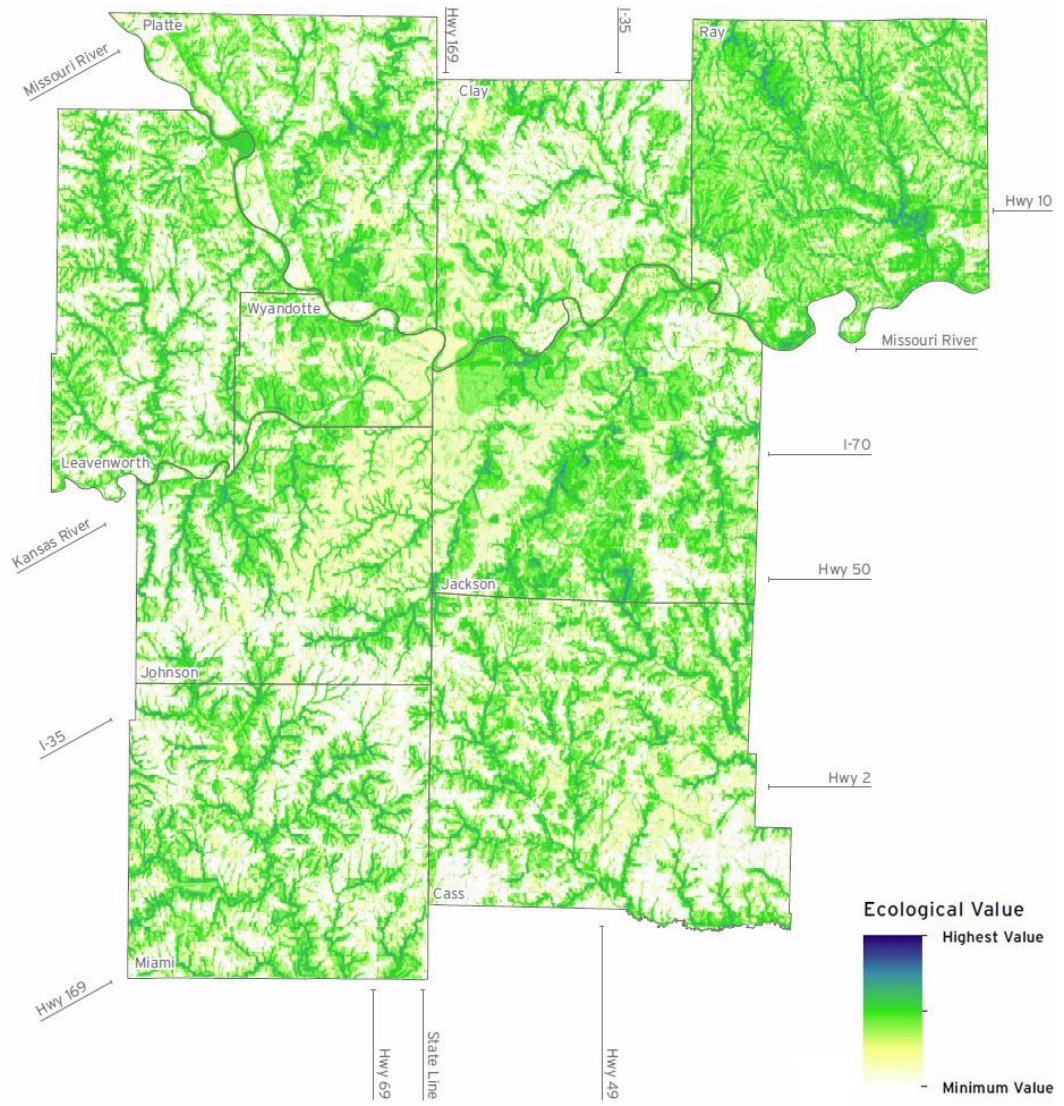
Green infrastructure framework



Atlas: Priority Areas

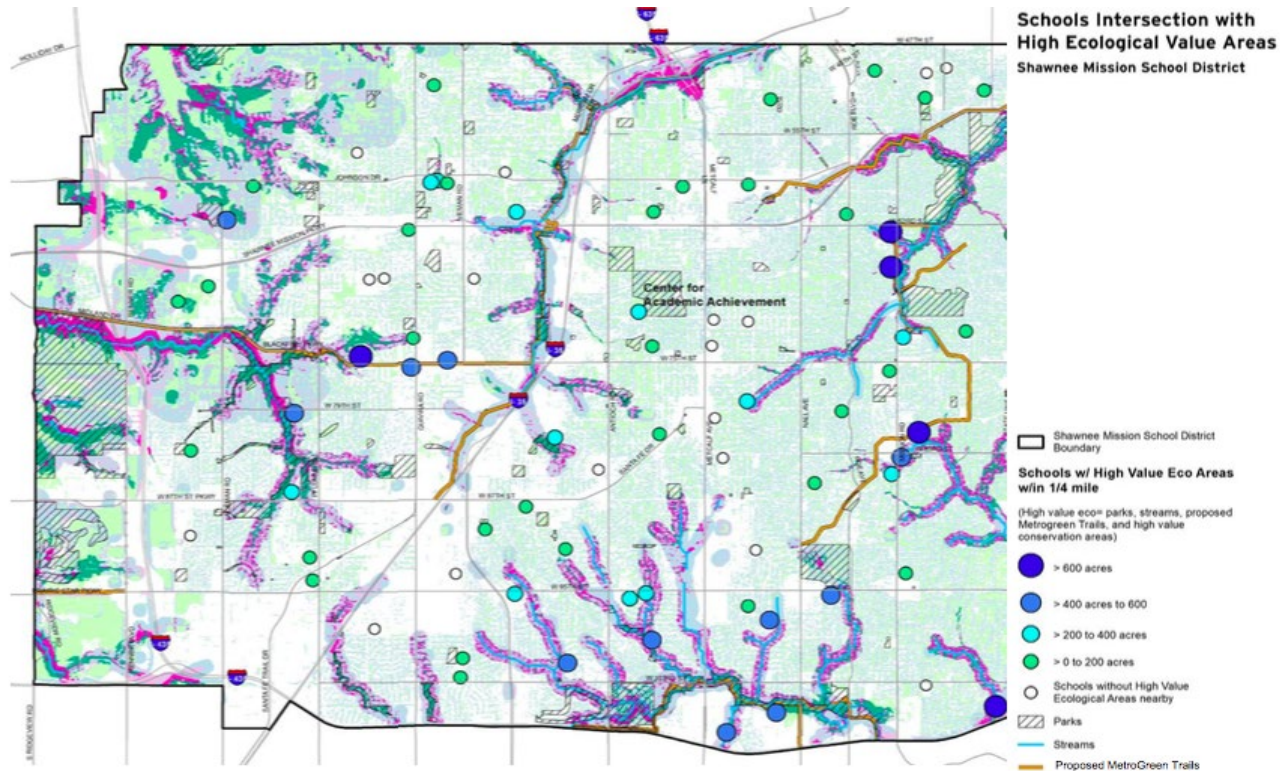


Identifies regional priority watershed-scale areas
