Risk Based Project Delivery Training Video



Description

Risk Based Project Delivery Training is a two-day training course developed to cover various on-going project delivery methods around the country. This training was provided and delivered to all seven districts, Central Office and over 100 program delivery staff on the options available to deliver projects. The Training covered MoDOT's history with alternative project delivery, the mechanics of a Project Delivery Determination Workshop, how to (and the importance of) programing potential APD projects in the STIP and so much more. The goals of this course were that each participant walked away with a better understanding of the available project delivery methods and when to use them. This training was well received by all who attended and spurred the use of Design-Build in parts of the state that have not utilized it before. A normal training like this is offered by private industry and would have significant costs to provide it to every district in the state.

Benefit

Providing in-house training gave program delivery staff in each district the opportunity to look for other ways to do business that helps save time, money and be responsible with the resources to deliver projects as MoDOT programs grow.
